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



Understanding the Waiver's Future

The Facts About the Waiver

- Extending the Waiver by two years—through the Omnibus federal spending bill signed in December provides important but only shortterm assurances to continue investing in the long-term success of HaH.
 - Medicare payment continues at the DRG rate and will continue through December 2024.
 - Medicaid rules may differ, and you must ask your state Medicaid team for more information.
- Participation, performance, and data collected will be closely monitored to inform the future and a longer-term solution to provide these services through Medicare and Medicaid and ensure patients in need continue to receive necessary patient-centered care.

Facts in Our Favor

- The results of the AHCAH Waiver program have been extraordinary to date as people with complex conditions previously requiring hospital admission can now receive high-quality, timely care from the comfort of their homes.
- This provides hospitals with additional capacity for the sickest patients and prevents patients from unnecessary hospitalizations and associated adverse outcomes.
 - To date, over 8,000 Medicare beneficiaries have been treated in HaH under the Waiver.
- HaH aligns with CMS' five-year strategic plan of comprehensively advancing health equity, expanding access to care, driving innovation, reducing the cost of care, and improving health outcomes.
 - The Waiver has served many Medicaid and dual-eligible populations with low overall escalation and unanticipated mortality.

Educate the Hill and CMS

Re-educate Congress about the value of HaH and the AHCAH waiver and create a sense of urgency to begin work now to create a pathway for a permanent and sustainable payment structure –

December 2024 will come quickly.

Engage in a collective dialogue with CMS on the quality and safety regulations required in statute to the waiver, based on UG experience and data.

Continue collecting and sharing experience and data, especially those highlighting health equity effects, with Federal and State policymakers.

Build new champions across Capitol Hill and the Agency who understand, support, and staunchly promote a sustainable and fair permanent payment structure for HaH.

Why the HaH Users Group Developed Program Standards

- Important that HaH provide high-quality care across the country with a clear definition
- Multiple groups interested in HaH Users Group point of view regarding program standards: CMS, The Joint Commission, NCQA
- Important that the HaH community provide stakeholders with a unified set of HaH Users Group developed and vetted standards



Use HaH Span Codes -National Uniform Billing Committee

- HaH UG succeeded in obtaining approval for 1 HaH "span code," 1 "revenue code"
- Allows for identification in claims of HaH inpatient use
- Important to facilitate robust claims analysis by CMS and investigators
- We estimate that only ~50% of patients cared for under the waiver are using these codes
- ALL HaH programs under waiver should use these codes





Act on Equity and Support Caregivers
